



October is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary in the Catholic Church. This devotion was formalized by Pope Leo XIII in 1884 and has roots in the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, which is celebrated on October 7 to commemorate a Christian victory in 1571 that was attributed to prayers of the Rosary.

The feast was instituted by Pope St. Pius V in 1571 to give thanks for a crucial Christian victory over the Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto. The victory was attributed to the widespread praying of the Rosary.



Pope Leo XIII officially dedicated the entire month of October to the Holy Rosary in 1884 to invoke Heaven's help during the Church's trials.

Catholics are encouraged to pray the Rosary, meditating on the mysteries of Jesus' life.

In addition, the Catholic Church celebrates several great saints known for their profound spirituality, reforms, and missionary work.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux (October 1): A French Carmelite nun who died at just 24, St. Thérèse of Lisieux is a Doctor of the Church and is known as "The Little Flower". She lived a cloistered life, but her "Little Way" of doing small things with great love has inspired millions. She was made the patron saint of missionaries because of her intense prayers for them. Her spiritual autobiography, Story of a Soul, is a classic of modern Catholic spirituality.

St. Francis of Assisi (October 4): Born into wealth in the 12th century, St. Francis chose a life of poverty and ministered to the poor and lepers. He is one of the most beloved saints in history for his deep love for all of creation. He founded the Franciscan order and is the patron saint of animals and the environment. It is a tradition in many churches to hold an animal blessing service near his feast day. Pope St. John XXIII (October 11): Known as the "Good Pope," Angelo Roncalli served as pope from 1958 to 1963. Despite being elected at an advanced age, he dramatically changed the course of the Church during his short papacy. Against the advice of many, he convened the Second Vatican Council to renew and modernize the Church. His feast day is celebrated on the anniversary of Vatican II's opening in 1962, rather than the date of his death.

St. Teresa of Ávila (October 15): A 16th-century Spanish mystic and Carmelite nun, St. Teresa of Ávila was a spiritual writer and a tireless reformer of her order. She founded new monasteries dedicated to a stricter rule of contemplative prayer. She was one of the first women to be declared a Doctor of the Church. Her mystical writings, including The Interior Castle, are foundational texts of Christian spirituality.
